## **REACH – EU Regulation on Registration, Evaluation, Authorization of Chemicals**

“REACH” is the EU Regulation dealing with Registration, Evaluation, Authorization of Chemicals. It has been issued on the 1st of June 2007 and is an update and an upgrading of legislation on Chemicals already in place in the EU.

REACH main target is safeguarding human health and environment from chemical risk. The Regulation is intended to foster alternative analytical methods and free circulation of goods on the internal market.

SO.G.I.S. has actively contributed to REACH Regulation implementation since 2003, cooperating with Industry Associations, both in Italy and abroad, in order to exempt many oleochemical substances, producing no risks, from registration obligation, and establish precise rules for law entry into force.

SO.G.I.S. has put in place all actions needed in order to guarantee compliance with REACH Regulation, to be able to match law requirements and check all suppliers compliance status.

SO.G.I.S. has met the registration obligations in 2010, 2013 and 2018 in due time, asking their customers to clarify downstream uses, so that registration is suitable for every required application.

## **CLP – Regulation 2008/1272/EC**

CLP is Regulation 2008/1272/EC, about classification, labeling and packaging of substances and mixtures.

It is an harmonized System for classification and labeling criteria and it is the UN GHS transposition.

It applies to production and use of Chemicals and Mixtures, without limitations on quantities produced on a yearly base. It does not apply to dangerous goods transport, but it is consistent with it.

Since 2010, SO.G.I.S. has always been complying with notification obligations required by this Regulation and, although not compulsory, as almost all of our substances are not classified, has prepared all Safety Information according to the MSDS format required by Regulation 2006/1907/EC.
